**What we have been learning ...**

**Year 3:** What do plants need to grow? Year 3 have been investigating that question this week, as well as learning about different parts of plants.

**Year 4:** The children have been extending their learning by completing addition on a number line and using Cuisenaire rods to show parts of a whole number. In their geography they have been discussing biomes.

**Year 5:** Have continued with the theme of WW1. This week they have investigated how reliable primary and secondary historical sources are.

**Year 6:** In their maths the children have been learning and extending their understanding of prime, square and composite numbers. In English they have been writing accurately punctuated dialogue.
