

Lionwood Junior School Pupil Premium Allocation 2011-2012

In the academic year 2011-2012 Norfolk County Council allocated Lionwood Junior School £33,875 as a Pupil Premium Grant.

Schools decide on how the premium is allocated as they are best placed to determine what additional provision should be made.

At Lionwood Junior School, we use an online tracking system to identify those children who require intervention to make expected or accelerated progress and who would most benefit from additional support.

The governing body have targeted the Pupil Premium Grant to:

- Financing of additional staff to allow for smaller maths sets in Year 6.
- Supporting accelerated progress in reading across Year 5 and 6 through the implementation of the Fresh Start and Read, Write Inc. Spelling Programme.
- Providing enrichment activities for pupils, including funding school trips and after school clubs.
- Additional hours for teaching assistants to increase intervention and support accelerated progress.
- A free Breakfast Club for children with FSM.
- Train teaching assistants to deliver a range of intervention programmes in both literacy and numeracy, including Sound Discovery.
- Employing a teacher with a specific focus on 1:1 tuition for pupils across the school that have been identified as needing to make accelerated progress.
- Supporting the Parent Support Advisor in her role reaching out to those who are potentially disengaged.

Outcomes for pupils

- Narrowing the gaps for children with a low spelling and reading age.
- Improvement in children's phonic knowledge.
- Improved reading and writing outcomes.
- Self esteem and attitude towards learning improved
- Teacher expertise improved
- Regular moderation across school means teacher assessment accuracy improved.
- Children's time in school increased.
- Progress accelerates as gap begins to narrow

For the academic year 2011-2012, the average attendance for children receiving free school meals was 94%.
